A comprehensive civics education program, Project ELECT - Educating Learners to Engage in Civics Today - will educate HCPS students, teachers, and community members about government and democracy. The grant will provide students with the opportunity to meet with local and national political leaders. Only three grants of this kind were presented by the Department of Education in fiscal year 2007, with HCPS being the largest at \$2,040,147 – the other two were under \$500,000.
