

Rep. Bilirakis Receives Prestigious George "Buck" Gillispie Award

WASHINGTON (12 June) - In recognition of his steadfast support for veterans rights and services, the Blinded American Veterans Foundation (BAVF) today awarded U.S. Rep. Gus M. Bilirakis (R-Fla.), with the prestigious George "Buck" Gillispie Award.

Presented on Thursday at the 23rd annual Blinded American Veterans Foundation (BAVF) Congressional Awards Reception, the distinguishes Members of Congress who have made significant contributions toward furthering the Foundation's efforts on behalf of sensory disabled American veterans. Bilirakis was honored in conjunction with House Armed Services Committee Chairman Ike Skelton (D-MO).
